Past Examples of Projects

Past projects that have received funding have included:

- Ag in the Classroom:
  - o Raised garden boxes and gardening books
  - o Outdoor learning space and garden expansion
  - Hoop-enhanced raised garden beds
  - o Building of a chicken coop
  - Creation of a children's garden and new outdoor classroom
  - Education kits containing ag lesson plans and teaching materials
  - Assistance with Ag Educator Workshops
- Consumer Awareness and Education:
  - Purchasing and placing approved ag books in local library systems
  - Agriculture Awareness Days
  - Building of an Ag Literacy Barn Bookshelf and purchase of approved ag books for use within the community
- Leadership Development:
  - o Sending a county representative to the Young Farmer Leadership Conference
  - Sending FFA members to the National FFA Convention

## Other Examples of Projects

## Projects may include:

- Ag in the Classroom:
  - o Incubator for a classroom
  - o Honeybee observatory for a classroom
  - o Farm Day at a school
  - o Greenhouse programs
  - o Agricultural learning projects for school children
  - o Technology programs within a school/classroom
  - Ag Book library
  - Expansion of any AITC project already in place
- Consumer Awareness and Education:
  - o Community garden
  - Community farmers market
  - Booth at a local fair or other community event
  - Bring an expert speaker in to a special event
  - Farm City Week events
- Leadership Development:
  - Assist with sending individuals to conferences or camps
  - o 4-H or FFA Camp Scholarship
  - o GFB Young Farmer events (state or national)



## Projects that are NOT ALLOWED:

- Funding for mileage
- Field trips
- Landscaping projects not designed to educate about growing food
- Wages or benefits to individuals
- One-time consumables
- Food
- Drinks
- Office supplies
- Farm Safety supplies
